

A lot of negative space with the sky, lighting is flat. Needs more texture.









This image has more than one subject. The blue door should be the primary because of the dynamic color. The flowerpots are static and distract from the door. The shoes are more tied to the door.



If the sword bearer was closer to the dragon, the story would have more impact. The other object in the image draw your eyes away from the subject.


